<ul> <li>Declaration(s) of Emergency and Los Angeles County Disaster Management AREA G</li> <li>This week marks the one-year anniversary of the City declaring a local emergency, as well as the commencement of this meeting.</li> <li>From this point forward, this weekly meeting will be cancelled. It will be replaced with the RPV PBL Q&amp;A on the first and third Wednesdays of the month at 3:00 pm PST. During the first 15 minutes, the City will give opening remarks/updates. The remaining 45 minutes will be Q&amp;A for the community. The City will ask the other stakeholders to attend. There will be a hard stop at 4:00 pm PST.</li> <li>The City Council approved the disbursement of \$2.8 million to go to the approximate 208 "affected" residents.
